In this 40-hour introductory class, students will delve into the world of Computer Numerical Control (CNC) machining in learning how to set up, operate, and learn the programming fundamentals of a CNC mill or lathe. Some of the areas covered will be operator and machine tool safety, quality measurements, set up, replacing components, and operating a CNC machine, modifying CNC parameters, learning G & M codes, modify CNC programming language, program and optimize a CNC mill or lathe, learning to control speed and feed rates, perform a CNC cutter compensation routine, and design a CNC program that has subprograms and canned cycles. Students will earn a CERTIFICATE of TRAINING in BASIC CNC MACHINING when successfully completing this program.

Pharmacy Technician Program

\$1,199 (includes books)

Tuesdays & Thursdays, 6:00-9:30 pm

This comprehensive 50 hour program will prepare students to work as a pharmacy technician in a retail or other pharmacy setting and to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's PTCB exam. Course content includes: pharmacy medical terminology, history, practice in multiple environments, calculations and measurements, prescriptions and drug names. Through classroom lecture and hands on labs, students will review many areas a Pharmacy Technician will handle including dosage calculations, drug classifications, billing and reimbursement among other items. Students will be eligible to participate in a 60 hour clinical externship with a local Retail Pharmacy. Students may be asked to submit to a thorough background check, drug screening and meet other requirements.

Clinical Medical Assistant Program

\$2,599 (includes books)

Tuesdays, Wednesday, Thursdays, 6:00-9:30 pm

This program is intended for students who want to prepare for an exciting, challenging and rewarding career in healthcare. This program will train students to assist physicians by performing functions related to the clinical responsibilities of a medical office including preparing patients for examinations and treatment, routine laboratory procedures, diagnostic testing, phlebotomy, pharmacology, taking and documenting vital signs, cardiology including proper lead placements, the proper use and administration of medications, a professional workplace behavior, ethics and the legal aspects of healthcare and more. This program includes 140 hours of classroom lecture and hands on labs and a clinical externship opportunity at a local healthcare provider. To be eligible for the clinical rotation, students must successfully complete the 140 hour program, submit to a thorough background check, drug screening and meet other requirements.

Note: Upon successful completion of this program, students would be eligible to sit for the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) national examination.

This Electronic Health Record (EH R) Management program prepares students to understand and use electronic records in a medical practice. An electronic health record (EH R) includes computerized lifelong healthcare data from a variety sources where every encounter an individual has with the healthcare system is documented and compiled for quick access. Electronic Health Record professionals are educated in the implementation and management of electronic health information using common electronic data interchange systems such as HL7, CDISC, and DICOM. Students will learn through classroom and computer lab training the necessary components consistent with maintaining the medical, legal, accreditation and regulatory requirements of the electronic health record and database.

Note: After the successful completion of this program, students will be prepared to sit for the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) Certified Electronic Health Record Specialist (CEHRS) exam.

This 90 hour Phlebotomy Technician Program prepares professionals to collect blood specimens from clients for the purpose of laboratory analysis. Students will become familiar with all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures completely and safely. Classroom and lab work includes terminology, anatomy and physiology; blood collection procedures; specimen hands-on practice; and training in skills and techniques to perform puncture methods.

This program is intended to provide students with a well-rounded introduction to medical administration so that a student can gain the necessary skills required to obtain a medical administrative assistant position in the health care field.
